Phonics	That all pupils who access this funding will pass the PSC at the end of Y1	July 2020
Spelling	That all pupils who access this funding will achieve at least Age related expectations Spelling by the end of each key stage.	July 2020

Priority 1	That all PP children develop Reading, Writing and Maths in line with peers, through QFT and additional timely support in lessons. Additional tutor time.
Priority 2	That pupils who have experienced personal trauma will have access to appropriate therapies within school hours.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Confidence and readiness to focus and learn and build secure positive relationships with adults and peers.
