

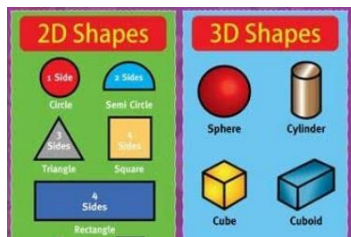
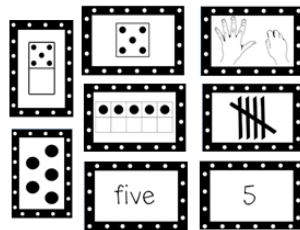

We are very fortunate to have Miss Hanif teaching in class on a Tuesday and Wednesday. Miss Hanif spent two days in school before the holidays so she has met the children and has worked alongside myself. I am sure you will join me in welcoming her to our school community.

Maths

Every day we will work with the children as a group on the carpet then small groups working on their mathematical understanding. To support this, we will be using a range of practical resources.

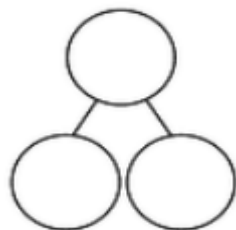


Shape – we will be describing and comparing both 2D and 3D shapes. We will be investigating the properties of different shapes and begin to

learn the names of different shapes.

Change within 5 –we will be finding one more and one less than. Building foundations for addition and subtraction.

Number bonds within 5 – we will be putting objects into two groups to work out all the different ways to make 5. We will be using a part whole model to represent our ideas.



English

We will be looking at texts linked to our topic 'Why do squirrels hide their nuts?' We will be reading stories that are set in autumn and explore hibernation and seasonal change. We will also be watching video clips of hedgehogs and writing non-fiction captions to match photographs.



Phonics

We will be finishing off our work on 'Phase 2' looking at the letter sounds - h, b, f, ff, l, ll, ss. We will be learning how to recognise these sounds to read and form them to spell. We will then move on to Phase 3 letter sounds (j,v,w,x,y, z, zz, qu, ch, sh, th, ng).

During our phonics sessions we will be focusing on reading and spelling words using the sounds we have learnt. We will also be continuing to learn the 'Tricky Words' from phase 2 and phase 3. These are words that cannot be sounded out but just have to be learnt. Each week we will be learning 3-4 new sounds and focusing on certain tricky words. **We will let you know each week in the reading record book and on Tapestry which sounds and words we are looking at in phonics.**

<p>RE - Our topic for this term is: God's Family</p> <p>In our RE work we will be talking about who is in our family and why are they special. We will be recalling special family memories to help us with this we would appreciate if you could post photographs of a special family meal or occasion on Tapestry so we can use this as a discussion point in our lessons. We will be learning about Mary and Joseph as Jesus' family. Then we will be learning about how we are all part of God's family and how God has given us all gifts. We will end the topic learning about how God gave us his greatest gift Jesus.</p>	<p>Diwali –</p> <p>In St Francis class we focus on celebrations from around the world throughout the year. The first celebration we will be learning about this year is the Hindu festival of Diwali. Diwali takes place this year on 4th November.</p>	<p>PE – In PE this term we will be learning about:</p> <p>Dance</p> <p>The children will have PE on a Tuesday. We are very fortunate that a specialist teacher from the Northern Arts Factory who will be working alongside Mr Gibson to deliver these high-quality sessions. Throughout the term the children will also be working on their balance, agility and co-ordination.</p>
<p>The children will be taught in a creative way through themes and topics, through a given theme we then cover key skills from all aspects of the Early Years Foundation Stage. Through our environment inside and outside we will encourage the children to be independent, curious and learn through exploration and play.</p>		
<p>Curriculum- This half term our topic is 'Why do squirrels hide their nuts?'</p>		
<p>Communication and Language</p> <p>As a class we will be making predictions on what might happen in a story, listening to a range of stories, learning to ask questions about stories or pictures. Expressing our ideas and views on questions asked by the teachers.</p>		
<p>Physical Development</p> <p>The children will be learning the rules and routines needed to ensure that P.E. is safe and fun. They will spend lots of time outside playing on the balancing and climbing equipment. We will be playing games looking at moving like different creatures. We will also be working on using a range of implements to write and make marks with both inside and outside.</p>		
<p>Understanding the World- The Natural World– We will be going on a walk to the woodland area in our school grounds to explore and observe a natural autumnal environment. We will be investigating what happens to different foods when they are left outside for longer periods of time looking and decay and changes that occur. We will also be sorting different types of animals into different groups such a wild animals or farm animals. Towards the end of the term we will investigate the question 'what comes after autumn?'</p>		
<p>Expressive Arts and Design: We will be creating 'diva lamps' linking to our work on Diwali. For this we will be working with and manipulating clay. Then decorating the lamps using a range of resources and colours. We will then move on to looking at land artists and making art using natural woodland materials.</p>		
<p>Science: - 'Seasonal Change'</p> <p>We will be observing changes that take place within the four seasons, we will be looking at how seasonal change affects animals (hibernation and migrations), we will be looking at and describing the weather and length of the day changes of the different seasons.</p>		
<p>To help your child at home you could -</p> <p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Where possible we would recommend you hear your child read daily. Please can you go through the sound book with your child daily. Encourage your child to make the sound, think of words that start with that sound and practise writing the letter.

Numbers

Play games with your child that involve numbers, counting and using a dice. Encourage your child to find numbers in their environment.
