KS2 SAT's information
9th - 13th May 2022

⦿ **When will KS2 SATs take place in 2022?**

- ⦿ The **Year 6 KS2 SATs** will be administered in the week commencing Monday 9th May 2022.
- ⦿ The timetable will be:
- ⦿ **Monday May 9th 2022:** Spelling, punctuation and grammar Paper - Grammar/Punctuation- 45 minutes
- ⦿ **Monday May 9th 2022:** Spelling, punctuation and grammar Paper - Spelling- 20 minutes
- ⦿ **Tuesday May 10th 2022:** Reading Paper - 60 minutes
- ⦿ **Wednesday May 11th 2022:** Maths Paper 1 (Arithmetic)- 30 minutes
- ⦿ **Wednesday May 12th 2022:** Maths Paper 2 (Reasoning)- 40 minutes
- ⦿ **Thursday May 13th 2022:** Maths Paper 3 (Reasoning)- 40 minutes

◎ **Key Stage 2 Reading**

- ◎ The reading test is a single paper with questions based on three passages of text. There will be **one hour**, including reading time and time to complete the questions.

- ◎ **Key Stage 2 grammar, punctuation and spelling test**
- ◎ The grammar, punctuation and spelling test consists of two parts: a **grammar and punctuation paper** requiring a variety of short answers which lasts **45 minutes**
- ◎ A **spelling test of 20 words** lasting **20 minutes**.

- ⦿ **Key Stage 2 maths**
- ⦿ Children sit three papers in maths:
- ⦿ **Paper 1: arithmetic, 30 minutes**
- ⦿ **Papers 2 and 3: reasoning, 40 minutes per paper**
- ⦿ **Paper 1** will consist of fixed response questions, the children have to give the correct answer to calculations, including long multiplication and division.
- ⦿ **Papers 2 and 3** will involve a number of question types, including:
 - ⦿ Multiple choice
 - ⦿ True or false
 - ⦿ Constrained questions, e.g. giving the answer to a calculation, drawing a shape or completing a table or chart
 - ⦿ Less constrained questions, where children will have to explain their approach for solving a problem

- ① **How are Key Stage 2 SATs marked?**
- ② **You will be given your child's scaled score and whether they have reached the expected standard set by the Department for Education.**
- ③ **'NS' means that the expected standard has not been achieved.**
- ④ **'AS' means the expected standard has been achieved.**

Writing

- ◎ **Writing is teacher assessed.**
- ◎ **Results are submitted at the end of June.**
- ◎ **Children have to achieve objectives several times throughout the year to enable them to achieve standards securely.**
