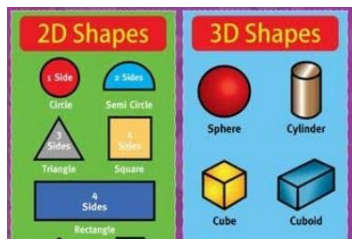
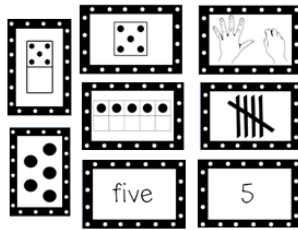

Maths

Every day we will work with the children as a group on the carpet then small groups working on their mathematical understanding. To support this, we will be using a range of practical resources.

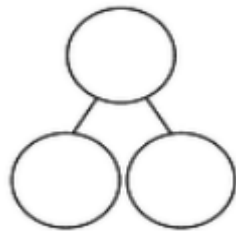


Shape – we will be describing and comparing both 2D and 3D shapes. We will be investigating the properties of different shapes and begin to

learn the names of different shapes.

Change within 5 –we will be finding one more and one less than. Building foundations for addition and subtraction.

Number bonds within 5 – we will be putting objects into two groups to work out all the different ways to make 5. We will be using a part whole model to represent our ideas.



English

We will be looking at texts linked to our topic 'Starry Night' We will be reading stories that are set in space or explore animals that come out in the night (nocturnal). We will end our work this half term looking at writing letters to someone very important who will be visiting on December 24th and reading Stickman - which is already one of our favourites!



Phonics

We will be finishing off our work on 'Phase 2' looking at the letter sounds - h, b, f, ff, l, ll, ss. We will be learning how to recognise these sounds to read and form them to spell.

During our phonics sessions we will be focusing on reading and spelling words using the sounds we have learnt. We will also be continuing to learn the 'Tricky Words' from phase 2 . These are words that cannot be sounded out but just have to be learnt. Each week we will be learning new sounds or focusing on certain tricky words. **We will let you know each week on Tapestry which sounds and words we are looking at in phonics.**

RE - Our topic for this term is: God's Family

We will be learning about Mary and Joseph as Jesus' family. We will learn about how Mary got asked to do the most important job - in being Jesus' mummy. We will look at how Jesus was born in a stable and who came to visit the new born king.



Diwali –

In St Francis class we focus on celebrations from around the world throughout the year. The first celebration we will be learning about this year is the Hindu festival of Diwali.



PE – In PE this term we will be learning about:

Throughout the term the children will also be working on their balance, agility and co-ordination.

The children will be taught in a creative way through **themes and topics**, through a given theme we then cover key skills from all aspects of the Early Years Foundation Stage. Through our environment inside and outside we will encourage the children to be independent, curious and learn through exploration and play.

Curriculum- This half term our topic is 'Starry Night'



Communication and Language -As a class we will be making predictions on what might happen in a story, listening to a range of stories, learning to ask questions about stories or pictures. Expressing our ideas and views on questions asked by the teachers.

Physical Development - The children will be learning the rules and routines needed to ensure that P.E. is safe and fun. They will spend lots of time outside playing on the balancing and climbing equipment. We will also be working on using a range of implements to write and make marks with both inside and outside.

Personal, social and emotional development - We will be looking at our bedtime routine and looking at how we get ready for bed. We will be focussing particularly on oral hygiene and talking about the importance of brushing our teeth twice a day and avoiding sugary snacks and drinks.

World- The Natural World– We will be talking about how the environment changes during the day and the night. We will be exploring the world around us by looking closely at the group of animals that awaken during the night, we will be learning that these are called nocturnal animals.

World - Past and Present - We will look at who works in our community through the night and talking about their roles in our society.

Expressive Arts and Design: We will be making a comforter for night time as a 'cuddle pet'. We will also be looking at 'light and dark' and using this to mix paint and make new colours.

Science: - '**seasonal change**' - We will be looking at how the weather and length of day light will change this half term. We will be observing the changes as we move from Autumn to Winter.

To help your child at home you could -



Encourage your child to rehearse writing their own name.

Reading

Where possible we would recommend you hear your child read daily. When you have listened to your child read (or discussed what is happening in a story) please write a comment or sign to show that the book has been read. Reading books will be changed twice a week.

Please make sure that your child's book is kept in their book bag and **brought to school every day**. The teaching staff will listen to your child read during the week and will need their reading book and reading record to do so.

Sound book (the little green book)

Please can you go through the sound book with your child daily. Encourage your child to make the sound, think of words that start with that sound and practise writing the letter.

Numbers

Play games with your child that involve numbers, counting and using a dice. Encourage

A significant part of the Early Years curriculum is physical development to support this the children will always have the option of going outside so it is important that they have the appropriate attire. **Every child should bring a warm outdoor coat to school daily and a pair of wellies that can be left in school. Children should also have a hat, scarf and some warm gloves.**

School fruit and milk

We are fortunate that every child is able to have a piece of fruit as their snack in school every day. We do not need you to provide your child with an additional snack.
